Activities that SHOULD be completed over the term.

Maths activities

- Play on [Times Table Rockstars](#) - your child will have an individual login to access this. Go for it!
- Play [Countdown](#) – get as close to the target number as you can!
- Play on [Hit the Button](#) - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.
- Practise place value with [these cool games](#).

- Practise your 'Five a Day' on [Corbett Maths](#), with five Maths SATs-style questions, with four levels of difficulty.

Reading activities

- Sign up to [Summer Reading Challenge](#) for free and discover a range of cool reading resources!
- Log on to Accelerated Reader and do a quiz!
- Share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.
- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read - talk about the characters and what might happen next. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch [Newsround](#) and discuss what is happening in the wider world
- Read a book together on [Oxford Owl](#), discuss what your child enjoyed about the book (you will need to create a free parent log in)
- Try and hunt for this term's English 'Big Six' words in books, magazines or the newspaper. Can you find them all?* If you bring proof that you've managed to find all six, there's a prize waiting for you! 😊

Spelling activities (or Phonics)

- Practise the Year 5/6 [Common Exception](#) words - can you use them in a sentence?
- Play games on the Year 5/6 list on [Spellzone](#).
- Try and find as many words as you can from the nine letters on [this website](#) (you can change the letters to make it a bit trickier).
- Practise your weekly spellings - look, cover, write check. Can you write them in a sentence? Forwards and backwards? Create a poster of their meanings, synonyms and antonyms?

OPTIONAL wider curriculum ideas to try!

Discussion/learning talk time

- Talk to your child about what they have been learning in Science:
What do they know/what have they learnt about separating materials? What does reversible and irreversible mean?
What else can they find out? Can you find out about any separating materials in the local area?
- Encourage them to look for anything related to materials...

Let's Wonder:

- What would it be like to live in the rainforest or South America? What would life be like? What would someone your age be doing?
- What would it be like in a different climate? What is the climate of South America?

Let's Create:

- Create your own collage about something that interests you. This could be of an animal, flowers or a person.
