It has continued to be a pleasure seeing our children enjoy their learning so far this term! In order to support deeper





This term, we have seen some amazing work produced and


have been incredibly proud of the care and pride that our children have taken - Mrs Charlton's and Mrs

School Development Priorities Update November 2020-21

Lots of work has already been completed towards our school development priorities this year and we wanted to give you a short update about the great things that 'Team Millbrook' have achieved so far!

- Implement a 'recovery' curriculum that provides children with a broad and balanced curriculum and which supports pupils to learn the most important content that was missed over lockdown.
 - Staff have been working closely in their year groups to identify any areas that children have needed further support with post lockdown – this has included small group work; 1:1 support; additional activities to practise at home and nurture sessions. We have been so proud of all of our children!
 - We have also continued to work on our exciting wider curriculum (for more information see our curriculum update section!)
- Fully implement a digital learning platform to improve remote learning; provide better connections between home and school and support school operations.
 - o Work continues to enhance our remote learning offer and develop our use of 'TEAMs' across the school. This has included a wide variety of staff training sessions; familiarising our older children with the program; E Safety lessons and developing clear plans and guidance for how the software will be used.
- We now have a dedicated 'Online Platform' section on our website where we will continue to upload communication and videos in the near future. We are very excited about sharing your child's log-ins and 'how to guides' with parents and carers soon – watch this space!
- Re-launch 'Building Learning Powers' across the school to continue to grow positive learning habits and attitudes.
 - o Children have enjoyed using their learning powers in class and we have continued to embed '**collaboration**' alongside launching our new focus this term; '**managing distractions**.'
 - o We now have a fabulous BLP display in our school hall and our Year 4 corridor to celebrate our

BLP 'super powers' and to raise the profile further across the school!





Junior Leadership Team

This term, we have been focusing on behaviour at break and lunchtimes. Mr Jacques is currently writing a new behaviour policy and has asked for our help to complete the break and lunchtime section. We are working together to create 5 rules for break time and lunchtimes. Also, the JLT have had a great idea to reward

well behaved children! Together, we are hoping to launch this in January. Our tasks include: researching, writing letters and talking to different members of the Millbrook community.

The only thing we could hold close was a gun


Remember the day

Parents and carers play a vital role in safeguarding children in their community. Handwashing advice



It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside).
