# **Curriculum Update!**

It has been an incredibly busy term with huge amounts of work continuing to develop our curriculum at Millbrook.



As you may have seen from our social media pages on Facebook and Twitter, our children have been engaging



in a huge number of exciting activities across all subjects – it has been wonderful to see them talk so excitedly and proudly about the new knowledge and skills they have learnt

As a school we have continued to work extremely hard to develop a clear progression across the school in all subjects, from Early Years through to Year 6. Our focus this term has been on enhancing our curriculum in History and Geography, ensuring that children understand the 'bigger picture context' and key, technical vocabulary as part of their learning – for example, Year 5 started their learning about the Amazon rainforest by finding out about biomes and the different climates around the world. We have also started to introduce historical timelines into every classroom, to help our children to understand and recall the links between the aspects of History



they have learnt whilst at Millbrook. Our staff will be spending some dedicated time this term to further develop our classroom learning; we can't wait to share some pictures!

As part of our curriculum development, we have been grateful for the support that we have received from the Vale Academy Trust. Our staff have enjoyed some training from Mr. Campbell linked to our new Music Scheme; support from Mrs. Boaz in planning Computing and we have loved putting some of the 'top tips' from Mr. Holloway in place for Science this term – Year 6 for example, loved their practical investigations to

discover which beak shape was best for picking up a

variety of objects!



Finally, due to the impact of Covid-19, we have been committed to ensuring that all children are given a wide range of opportunities to be active. Alongside our fabulous Forest

School provision, we have been delighted to welcome TA Sports, who have been providing some fantastic PE lessons, which we know both staff and children have absolutely loved!



# **New Millbrook Uniform and Logo!**



We have some very exciting news to share – from September 2021, Millbrook will be launching a **new uniform** and **sports kit** for all children from Reception to Year 6!

Please note: children <u>can</u> still wear their current Millbrook uniform from September, until a replacement is needed. Nursery children will also have the option to purchase a new 'Millbrook Nursery' jumper should you




wish to. The new uniform is now available to view and purchase ready for the new school year (not next term!) from PMG Schoolwear (our current providers).

The aim will be that **by September 2022**, all children will have moved to wearing the new uniform.

### How is the uniform changing?



Our new uniform will reflect the key aims of our new identity; it will characterise the high standards of education we aim to deliver, and the excellence we aim to achieve in educating children at Millbrook. As shown in the photo opposite, the uniform looks smart, distinctive and also practical; by wearing it, children show that they are



part of the school, take pride in representing the school, and the uniform provides children with a collective identity.

## What will stay the same?

Summer dresses will remain the same, as will expectations for grey trousers, skirts or shorts with school uniform and plain black leggings, joggers or shorts for PE uniform.

## PE Kits

We have also decided that from September, we will continue with the practice of children wearing their Sports kit into school on their two days of

PE. For this reason, we have also refreshed and updated our PE kit. This means that in a week, children from Year 1-6 will have:



• 2 days where they wear their sports kit into school.



From September 2021, we would like <u>all children</u> from Year 1 to Year 6 to wear a **navy blue t-shirt** and **black sweater** for their 2 days of PE. The new sports kit has our new 'MBK'

**Sport**' logo on it (see photos below. These can also be purchased from PMG Schoolwear. This means children will no longer need to wear house colour t-shirts.

Please can we remind you that on their PE days, children should also be wearing **plain** black leggings, shorts or jogging bottoms.

NB: If your child is starting in Reception, they will only have PE on 1 day per week and so will only need the navy PE t-shirt (as PE is also indoors).



#### Where can I see the new uniform?

A number of items in the school uniform will carry the new logo. Each element of the new school uniform for boys and girls will be summarised for you <u>on our website</u>, as well as on the <u>PMG uniform supplier page</u> where each item of class uniform, sportswear and accessories are listed: <a href="https://www.pmgschoolwear.co.uk">https://www.pmgschoolwear.co.uk</a>

By our supplier (PMG) remaining the same, this helps us to keep the costs as low as possible. This will be a steady introduction of uniform as families replace outgrown or worn out items.

#### Some key points to note:

- The new sports/PE kit is compulsory from September
- If you have a child going into Year 6, you do not need to purchase the new uniform unless you would like to.
- Please NAME ALL UNIFORM to help return any misplaced or lost items to their owner

Please remember that we are <u>not</u> expecting you to have full new uniform ready for September 2021 – this is a gradual school uniform migration over the course of the year. However, your child/ren can wear the new style school uniform from September 2021 if you choose to. On the first day of term in September, we will ensure all jumpers are named to help ensure lost property is returned quickly.

### **New Logo**

We have also updated our school logo, which (as shown opposite) includes an updated graphic and colour, as well as including our school motto, 'Believe, Achieve, Succeed'. Over time, you will begin to see the new updated logo more and more.

The brief to our designers was for something new that appeared crisp, approachable, smart and fresh. We love it and believe the refresh better matches what we've become and creates a platform for further changes we are making over the next few months.



#### Looking ahead

Behind the scenes, we are busy making plans for 2021-2022! This includes the allocation of staff to classes and the transition process for the children. Once dates have been agreed and confirmed across the trust for transition day, we will share further plans with you.

We hope that you are as excited as us with this new look and feel for Millbrook! We believe that this is another really positive step in our journey towards becoming an exceptional school.

Look out for more updates and changes - like our brand new website (coming soon), school environment improvements (inside and out), and playground developments - as we continue to shape a new exciting future for our children.

# **School Development Priorities**

the doors with smiles and a slight nervousness about them.


The coach journey was a sign of things to come with the ups and downs of the back roads enabling the pupils to begin to conquer their fears and not succumb to travel




**Book Corner!** Looking for a good book? In this section, we have asked two of our teachers to recommend a book they've enjoyed recently!

## For our younger readers, Miss Hornsey recommends...

#### Here We Are: Notes for Living on Planet Earth by Oliver Jeffers

This book is a fantastic way to introduce children to non-fiction texts in a way that is still very engaging and story-like in it's appearance. Written as a manual to life on Earth from a new dad to his baby son, this picture book is an overview of Earth and a guide to living well. The things I love most about this book are the beautiful illustrations and messages of kindness, tolerance and environmental responsibility. It provokes a lot of discussion and is fantastic for helping children explore and understand their place in the world and to know that they are never alone. It is very re-readable and I honestly cannot recommend it enough!



## For our older readers, Mrs Trinder recommends...

#### The Girl Who Speaks Bear by Sophie Anderson



This book tells the story of twelve-year-old Yanka, who was found in a bear cave as a two-year-old. She is adopted by Mamochka, a village herbalist. As she grows, she has always felt that she doesn't belong and wondered about where she comes from. The other children call her 'Yanka the Bear' as she is so much bigger and stronger than them. One day, she wakes up find that her legs have become bear legs, and she can talk to animals. Leaving the village behind, she sets off into the forest on a quest to find who she is.

The story is beautifully written, and woven into the main story of Yanka's journey are magical tales about dragons, princesses and bears. My favourite character is the weasel, 'Mousetrap', who battles a pack of wolves and rides a fish owl to help Yanka. As the quest unfolds,

however, Yanka is joined by an ever-growing group of fascinating characters. These include the House with Chicken Legs (from the previous book) and the Yaga, who guide spirits of the dead.

Yanka faces dangers and perilous challenges on her quest of discovery. Along the way, she learns about the importance of family, identity, friendship and loyalty. This book is set in a fantastical world of magic with intriguing characters and adventure. It is utterly gripping - a great, enjoyable read. Highly recommended!





## Safeguarding - What you can do



Parents and carers play a vital role in safeguarding children in their community. This safeguarding hub seeks to enable the sharing of information so that risks to children can be identified at an early stage. ## Handwashing advice



It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside).
