Curriculum – Teaching and Learning update

It has been a fantastic start to the year and a huge amount of work has already taken place to develop our work on the curriculum. September started with a fantastic INSET session, led by Mr Baish, which recapped our new approach to planning the curriculum and how we will measure its impact; conversations with our pupils about their learning and enjoyment being the main indicator!



Training has also taken place for R.E and History, with staff meetings led by Mrs Sanhotra and Miss Meyer – staff thoroughly enjoyed these sessions and we have already seen some great success in the classrooms!



After the positive feedback from Ofsted last term as part of our monitoring visit, we were also delighted to be asked to share some of our work with curriculum leaders across the Vale Academy Trust; we proudly shared the way in which we developed our vision and planned our curriculum to ensure that there is a clear progression in knowledge and skills; lessons that inspire curiosity in learning and ensure that their learning 'sticks!' As you may have seen from our letters home, we have also re-launched and reviewed our approaches to both *Homework* and *Feedback and Marking* so that they are in line with the latest research but also so that we can continue to support our children to learn in the best

possible way. We hope that you have found the changes to homework helpful, and we will soon be seeking some of your feedback and thoughts to help us review how it is supporting your child's learning at home.

Our focus for the remainder of this year will be to implement our new curriculum planning. We will be supporting our fantastic teachers and support staff to develop how they teach (their 'pedagogy') even further so that we can become the 'exceptional' school that we strive to be every day. This professional development will be through coaching; staff meetings; external input and opportunities to talk together about



activities that have been successful in the classroom. We can't wait to share our updates with you! Watch this space!

School Development Priorities

Our school development priorities for the year ahead are detailed below and include some of the key actions that we plan to take in each area; look out for the next edition of 'Millbrook Connect' to find out how we are getting on! We have already achieved lots this year!



Key priority 1: Curriculum implementation

Focus on the implementation of the newly developed curriculum so that it is taught consistently well from Early Years to Year 6.

- Support for subject leaders
- Staff meetings linked to key subject areas, for example 'Writing'
- Time for teachers to plan together and share ideas
- Expert 'teacher' input, for example Music and Computing specialists
- Cross-school collaboration with other VAT schools

Key priority 2: Early Reading

Implement the newly chosen phonics programme from Nursery to Year 4 (Read, Write, Inc) and ensure that all staff are trained to deliver it effectively.

- Staff training
- Purchasing of new books to carefully match children's decoding ability

Key priority 3: Grow and develop teachers

Grow and support teachers to develop their practice so that teaching across the school is excellent.

- 1:1 Coaching using the latest research and advice linked to high quality teaching and learning
- Staff meetings, including time to prioritise planning
- Online/face to face courses
- Subject specialist teachers and support from senior leaders
- Staff 'CPD' libraries

Year 6 Residential







The excitement was palpable as we started the term knowing that PGL was only a few weeks away! As we crept closer to departure day, the excitement intertwined with nerves for many of the children who were staying away from home for the first time. When pupils begin to arrive with luggage bigger than themselves, teddies in hand and a sense of adventure, it always creates an amazing atmosphere but there seemed to be something special about this bunch; something different.

We arrived at Liddington in record time and before picnicking on the field bathed in sunshine, we dropped our luggage into our new homes for the next couple of nights. The first activities for the afternoon revealed what was so special about this group; not a single person shied away from anything. This was a theme that would continue to run

throughout this trip with the bravery of the young people, their enthusiasm towards themselves as well as others, and their compassion for each other when things were difficult. As one pupil genuinely and kindly said: "Well done for trying" as Mr Law couldn't quite complete a small wall. It was inspirational to see how these young people overcame challenges, cheered on by their friends.

During the next couple of days the children were able to test themselves on heights with rock climbing, abseiling, the giant swing, zipwire and trapeze. They were able to work





together on the challenge course whilst testing their skills in archery as well. A favourite was the canoeing which turned into a swim for some! As the evenings rolled in, a scavenger hunt in the dark and a camp fire with s'mores and a sing-song kept us entertained. The children were complimented for their Millbrook manners throughout the trip from so many of the instructors and they were a credit to themselves and the school. We couldn't be more proud of all of the children

who made this trip incredible.

A special mention must go to all of the teachers and adults who helped before, during and after the trip so thank you: Mrs Smith, both Mrs Walkers(!), Mrs Buchanan, Mrs Packard, Mrs Beaumont, Miss Willis, Mr Jacques and Mr Law.

When discussing what they think makes Millbrook so caring, they gave the following examples which were lovely to hear:

- Our nurture base, 'The Nest'
- Assemblies that cover topics such as anti-bullying and kindness
- Millbrook Manners and celebration of politeness
- BLP (Building Learning Powers)
- 'It is because in the Foundation Stage, they teach the children about sharing and kindness and that goes through school.'

The parliament then shared some really lovely suggestions to develop this even further with Mrs Youngman and Mrs Charlton. Having spoken to their classes, they have agreed the following actions for the next term:

Finally, Emily (our Head Girl) also had the pleasure of joining the first full Vale Academy Trust

Parliament to discuss some new and exciting projects across the Trust – we were so incredibly proud of how Emily represented the school and how maturely and confidently she explained her ideas!

Read Write Inc comes to Millbrook!

Reading is the key to success

It is essential that, by the end of their primary education, all pupils are able to read fluently, and with confidence, in any subject in their forthcoming secondary education.

The Reading Framework July 2021



This term we have launched Read Write Inc: a phonics programme which helps children learn to read fluently and at speed so they can focus on developing their skills in comprehension, vocabulary and spelling.

Read Write Inc is a systematic way of teaching phonics. The children are taught a new sound and they then read a book that matches this as part of the same lesson.

The children are enjoying the programme and we are very pleased that **we can already see good progress**. Children in Reception are confidently writing their sounds daily and learning to



segment and blend with Fred the Frog (see photo on the left!), Year 1 are learning about 'special friends' (sounds written with more than one letter, e.g sh, ng, qu) and red (tricky)words, and Year 2 have been consolidating their knowledge before taking the phonics screening check in November.

We are eagerly awaiting **our delivery of new books**! These will be used as part of the lessons and to send home. The children will also be able to access e-books and quizzes at home and school via Oxford Owl.

We are looking forward to telling you more about Read Write Inc at our parents' information meetings next term, so please make sure you sign up for one of these. During the evening you will have an opportunity to look at the books and see what is available via the e-library. We will be handing out information booklets, sharing links to videos and telling you more about Fred the Frog! Everyone who attends a meeting will be entered into a free raffle with the chance of winning some phonics resources!

Teaching reading is a partnership between school and home. We hope you are ready to join us on our journey to ensure every child at Millbrook becomes a confident and fluent reader! See some photos of RWI in action on the next page!

Where the Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak


I absolutely loved this book growing up!



Reading success in Term 1!

Listening to/reading with your child every day has been highlighted as the most important activity in our home learning – research suggests that this is the activity that has the greatest impact on children's learning. We value the support you provide through ensuring your child reads daily and we have been really impressed by the number of words our children have already read in Term 1 – a total of 1,866,141 words!



Reading quizzes – in school and at home

The Accelerated Reader scheme enables children to complete quizzes on the books that they have read which tests the children's comprehension. Children can also complete these guizzes at home



by visiting the 'Pupils/Class pages' section of the Millbrook School website and we also monitor/celebrate quiz successes in class!

Reading records

Alongside daily reading teaching in school, we keep close records of 1:1 reading at school in our class reading folders and have some exciting plans for parents to share home reading with us. We will provide more information about this in the coming weeks!

Handwashing advice



It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside).
