Harry, Emily, Raydee, Haydn, Savannah and Lucas (Year 6) – this team of Year 6s had a very



School Development Priorities & Teaching and Learning update

It has been such a short term, but it is amazing how much work we have managed to pack into a few weeks! As a school, we are really keen to share our development journey with our parents and carers, and we hope that you enjoy reading the latest updates about our key priorities as a school!

Key Priority 1: Curriculum Implementation

Focus on the implementation of the newly developed curriculum so that it is taught consistently well from Early years to Year 6.



✓ We held a briefing for all members of staff in 'Team Millbrook' after school to celebrate our successes and update everyone on our focuses for curriculum development this term – this was well-attended and enjoyed by all! Watch this space for a date for a future curriculum event for parents and carers!

✓ The Senior Leadership Team have continued to look at books and speak to children about their curriculum— we have been delighted to see some amazing learning and to hear the children talk about the curriculum so passionately! It is clear that children are enjoying lessons; remembering their learning and are making links which will help it 'stick!' We know that they are enjoying their regular 'recap' mini-quizzes!



✓ We are looking forward to welcoming Lynn Knapp (National Leader of Education) and some members of the Vale Academy Trust back into school next term to share more of our journey; this time linked specifically to Key Stage 2 Reading and 'non-core subjects.



✓ Members of the Senior Leadership team have been working with and supporting other schools within and outside of the Vale Academy Trust, for example leading reviews and collaborating with teachers to develop various subject areas—we are so proud of our team!

✓ Mrs Youngman, Mrs Charlton, Mrs Jacques and Mr. Baish, have also been working with some children in Year 6 to develop their confidence in certain areas of the curriculum; this has included small group, as well as 1:1 support and has been very much enjoyed by all; we have loved seeing the children so excited about Maths in particular!!

✓ Finally, (hot off the press!), we have held our first ever Millbrook Science Fair! Check out the article later in this edition of Connect!

Key Priority 2: Early Reading

Implement the newly chosen phonics programme from Nursery to Year 4 (Read, Write, Inc) and ensure that all staff are trained to deliver it effectively.

- ✓ Mrs Charlton and Mrs Youngman visited Windmill Primary School (another school who have used) Read Write Inc successfully over a number of years) – we loved our visit and are excited about the next phase of our journey!
- ✓ We have ordered some new RWI resources to supplement our current library of books, including non-fiction reading materials, posters for classes and magnetic letter tiles. A huge thank you to FROM for helping us purchase these – we are so grateful!
- ✓ Mrs Keymer, Mrs Catungal and Mrs Donnellan have continued to work with teachers and support. staff in implementing Read Write Inc – it is certainly having a transformational impact across the school, and has been evidenced via pupil and parent views, as well as when we pop into classes! Great job everyone!

Key Priority 3: Grow and develop teachers

Grow and support teachers to develop their practice so that teaching across the school is excellent.

Our joint coaching project across both Millbrook and Charlton primary schools, led by Mrs Youngman and Mrs Campbell (from Charlton), is now in full swing! This term we have held a number of sessions for staff; including one linked to the Cognitive Science behind learning and remembering, as well as coaching training for members of the Senior Leadership team – we are super excited to continue to embed our culture of learning for everyone in Term 5 and we will keep you updated!






- A training programme for our support staff has been launched and will start after Easter; this will be linked to some fantastic new resources that form part of our development package for new teachers.

Science Week

This term, Millbrook held their very own Science week in conjunction with Science Oxford's Big

Science Event. During the week, each year group carried out lots of exciting investigations which were designed independently by the children. We saw great examples of collaboration, as the children worked in pairs to answer scientific questions such as 'Which material makes the best raincoat?' and 'How much water is needed to make the wobbliest jelly?' The children really took this chance to show off their working scientifically skills. We had Year 6 pupils



building complex electrical circuits, Year 4 trying to find soundproofing materials and Year 2 created ways to disperse seeds more efficiently! After finishing their experiments, each pair had to create a poster to show their findings and evaluate their own work – just like proper scientists.

Alongside the incredible lessons in class, KS1 had the opportunity to crawl inside the Explorer Dome when it visited the school. Once inside, they were treated to a fantastic light show and learnt so much about light and shadows. They made shadow puppets, used a mirrors ball to create different effects and it even rained inside! The children absolutely loved this experience and were all still talking about it days later.

At the end of Science Week, each class voted for a winning pair to go through to the in-school final. Their they talked about their experiments and showed off their work. The judges were very impressed with all the hard work and had such a tough time choosing the winners to go through

to the Big Science Event Final.



IMPORTANT MESSAGE

Vehicle idling – please STOP!

Unnecessary vehicle idling is a contributor to local air pollution and increased health risk to the children at Millbrook. One of the areas where unnecessary idling occurs the most is at schools by parents waiting to drop off and pick up their children.

We have included a fact sheet with this letter to give you more information on the hazards of idling and to help illustrate just why this issue is so critical.

We are encouraging parents to make an informal "No Idling" pledge and that you become an active participant in improving air quality and reducing health risks by eliminating idling within the school pick up zone.

The simple but critical change in behaviour of idling your vehicle will drastically improve the air quality in the community and the air your children breathe.

Idling Reduction Fact Sheet

Did you know?

- Each of us takes 20,000 breaths each day
- The average person breathes 3,400 gallons of air a day
- Children breathe 50 percent more air per pound than adults
- Vehicle exhaust is a key contributor to air pollution
- Idling wastes more fuel than turning your vehicle engine off and on again

Handwashing advice



It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside).
